City Council Appoints New Mayor and Vice Mayor

This past November residents took to the polls to select new members of City Council. The residents elected Kathy Wright and Chris Shamy while re-electing Peggy Eggleston, Dale Grimm, and Bill Cook. Each of the terms are for 4-years and will end on December 31, 2027.

Every two years, the City Council selects a new Mayor and Vice-Mayor from their current members. This cycle, they elected Bill Cook as the Mayor and Peggy Eggleston as the Vice Mayor.

City Council meets at the Smith Park Shelter House, 6PM, on the first and third Monday of each month. If a Monday falls on a holiday, the meeting is the next day.



New! Dillinger Hall!

The New Hall will be Available to Rent Starting February 5, 2024!

The new hall is roughly 2,000 square feet and includes a kitchenette with a refrigerator, sink, microwave and three-shelf commercial warmer, handicap accessible bathrooms, tables and chairs. City administration partnered with the Clark County Economic Development Department to secure \$430,000 in a Community Development Block Grant - COVID (CDBG-CV) to design and build the new shelter house. The cost to rent Dillinger Hall will be as follows:
