## Support Public Safety: Vote **YES** on the Police Renewal Levy This May 6

The City of New Carlisle is seeking the renewal of a **half-percent income tax** that funds critical police services. This **renewal levy generates approximately \$700,000 per year** and ensures continued funding for **law enforcement operations for another five years.**

This levy was first passed in **2015** and successfully renewed in **2020**. Thanks to the support of voters, the city has been able to **expand police coverage, growing to a current force of five deputies.** With increased staffing and coverage, our officers have been able to better serve and protect our community. By renewing this levy, we can **continue strengthening our police presence and enhancing public safety.**

This tax applies to earned income for residents of New Carlisle. The funds collected through this levy are **earmarked specifically for police activity**, meaning they can only be used for **law enforcement expenses, including new equipment, officer pay, and expenses at the Sheriff's Office.**

# SPRING CLEAN-UP & COMMUNITY BEAUTIFICATION

Spring is here, and it's time to refresh our community! The City of New Carlisle, in partnership with Rumpke, is here to help with your spring-cleaning needs. Whether you're clearing out old furniture, appliances, or just tidying up your yard, here's what you need to know:

## Rumpke Bulk & Trash Collection Regular Trash Pickup

- All materials should be placed in your cart and set at the curb the night before your collection day.
- Trash cans should not be left at the curb for more than 24 hours after collection.

## Bulk/Large Item Collection

- Rumpke will collect up to three bulk items per week on your regular service day.
- Acceptable items include appliances,

mattresses, box springs, sofas, and other large furniture.

- Upholstered items (sofas, mattresses, etc.) must be wrapped in a sealable plastic before being placed at the curb.
- Appliances containing Freon require special handling—Freon must be removed before pick-up.
- No need to call ahead—just place your items at the curb!

**Ongoing Work:** The project is progressing smoothly, with significant portions of water main replacements already completed. Crews will continue working in the project area over the coming months.

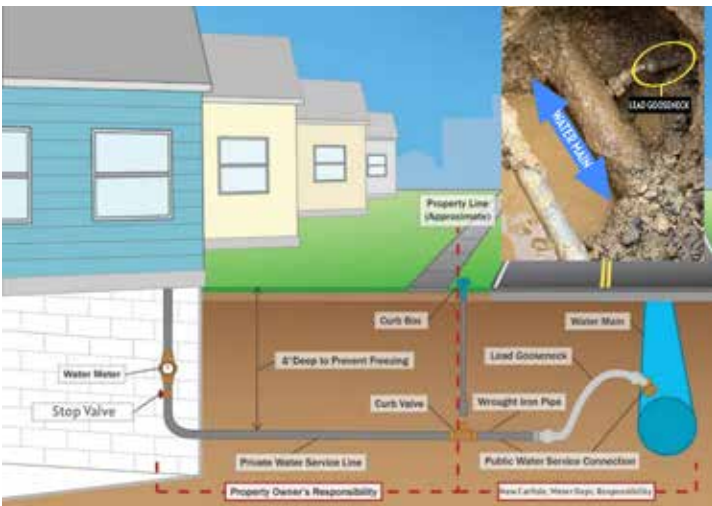
**Service Interruptions:** Temporary water outages may still occur as the work advances. We will do our best to provide advance notice whenever possible.

# CITY COUNCIL APPROVES BACKYARD CHICKENS FOR RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES

New Carlisle residents now have the opportunity to keep backyard chickens following the approval of Ordinance 2024-26. This change reflects the City Council's commitment to supporting sustainable practices while balancing community standards.

## Key Guidelines for Keeping Chickens:

- Only hens (female chickens) are allowed—roosters are prohibited to prevent noise disturbances.
- Chickens must be kept in rear yards only and housed in a coop, run, or chicken tractor that is screened from neighbors view.
- The slaughtering of chickens is not permitted within city limits.
- Only single-family dwellings are eligible to keep chickens.
- Property size limits apply:
  - Under 1 acre: Maximum of 6 hens
  - Minimum of 3 hens required on any property keeping chickens.

No permit is required, but compliance with city regulations will be enforced.

## EL CONCEJO MUNICIPAL APRUEBA LA CRÍA DE GALLINAS EN PROPIEDADES RESIDENCIALES

Los residentes de New Carlisle ahora tendrán la oportunidad de criar gallinas en sus patios traseros tras la aprobación de la Ordenanza 2024-26, que modifica el Capítulo 618 de los Códigos Codificados. Este cambio refleja el compromiso del Concejo Municipal de apoyar prácticas sostenibles mientras se mantiene el equilibrio con los estándares comunitarios.

## Normas Claves para la Cría de Gallinas:

- Solo se permiten gallinas (hembras)—los gallos están prohibidos para evitar ruidos molestos.
  - Las gallinas deben mantenerse únicamente en los patios traseros y alojarse en un gallinero, corral o estructura móvil que esté oculto de la vista de los vecinos.
  - No está permitido sacrificar gallinas dentro de los límites de la ciudad.
  - Solo las viviendas unifamiliares pueden criar gallinas.
  - Restricciones según el tamaño del terreno:
    - Menos de 1 acre: Máximo de 6 gallinas
    - Se requiere un mínimo de 3 gallinas en cualquier propiedad que las tenga.
- No se necesita un permiso, pero se aplicarán regulaciones municipales para garantizar el cumplimiento.

Esta ordenanza permite a los residentes tener más control sobre sus fuentes de alimentos mientras promueven el cuidado responsable de los animales. Spring brings warmer weather and more outdoor activities, but it also comes with seasonal risks. Stay safe with these quick tips!

### April: Stay Alert & Prepared

- **Distracted Driving Awareness** – Keep your phone down and focus on the road.
- **Spring Cleaning Safety** – Use chemicals properly, keep them in original containers, and ensure good ventilation.
- **Severe Weather Preparedness** – Have a plan for storms, floods, and tornadoes. Stay informed with local alerts. Sign up for Hyper Reach!
- **Home Safety Check** – Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and inspect your home for necessary repairs.

### May: Outdoor Safety Tips

- **Sun & Heat Protection** – Wear sunscreen, stay hydrated, and avoid peak sun hours.
- **Water Safety** – Never swim alone, supervise children, and wear life jackets when boating.
- **Grilling Safety** – Keep grills away from structures, never leave them unattended, and watch children and pets.

### June: Beat the Heat & Stay Safe

- **Heat Awareness** – Drink plenty of water, wear light clothing, and recognize signs of heat exhaustion.
- **Food Safety** – Keep perishable foods cold, cook meats properly, and avoid leaving food out too long.
- **Water Safety Reminders** – Stay cautious in natural water sources, and always supervise children.

### Motorcycle Awareness: Share the Road

- **Look Twice** – Check blind spots before changing lanes.
- **Give Space** – Motorcycles stop faster than cars; maintain a safe following distance.
- **Respect Riders** – Motorcycles have the same road rights as other vehicles.
- **Gear Up** – Always wear a helmet and protective clothing when riding.

### CODE COMPLIANCE TIPS

- Keeping trash and rubbish picked up from you yard will keep pest and animals away. Plus, it keeps your property looking clean
- Mow & maintain grass and weeds below 8 inches
- Items that belong indoors may not be stored outdoors, i.e., sofas, storage bins, appliances, and junk vehicles.
- Keep overgrown vegetation off fence lines, roofs, and neighboring properties.
- Do not park vehicles on grass! Trailers cannot be parked on the street without a vehicle attached and for no longer than 48 hours.

### NEED A PERMIT?

- Installing a new shed or replacement
- Installing a new fence or replacement
- Installing a new swimming pool or replacement
- Installing a new deck, porch, patio, or replacement
- Installing new exterior stairs / steps / ramps or replacement
- Installing a new garage or addition
- Building a new residential home
- Building a new commercial building
- Demolition of residential or commercial building
- New business, change of use / change of location / change of ownership
- Installing a new sign or replacement (any type of sign)

# CITY OF NEW CARLISLE LIMB AND BRUSH PICKUP GUIDELINES

The City of New Carlisle has a limb and brush pickup program free of charge for all City residents. This program will be conducted from April through November during the second full week of these months.

City employees will pick up limbs and brush in moderate amounts from pruning and trimming. This service will NOT include pick up of limbs and brush left from tree removals or large tree trimming projects, such as taking out a long hedgerow, etc. No grass or leaves permitted.

To participate in this program, you must sign up ONE WEEK in advance. You can sign up either by calling the cemetery office at 937-845-3624 or by email to [publicservice@newcarlisleohio.gov](mailto:publicservice@newcarlisleohio.gov). Leave the address for the pickup and a phone number, in case we have any questions regarding the pickup. Once you are registered, your limbs/brush will be picked up the second full week of the month, provided the following conditions are met:

1. Limbs/brush must be placed in the greenspace between your sidewalk and the road. **DO NOT PLACE IT IN THE ROAD.**
2. Limbs/brush must be placed with all the stems facing the same way, going with the direction of traffic.
3. The amount of limbs/brush to be picked up cannot exceed the amount two men can pick up in a 10-minute period. **AMOUNTS THAT EXCEED THIS LIMIT WILL BE LEFT FOR THE HOMEOWNER TO DISPOSE OF.**
4. There can be no roots attached. Limbs cannot be larger than 4" in diameter.
5. You must register at least ONE WEEK in advance.
6. Place limbs/brush in the greenspace no more than one week prior to pickup and no later than Sunday before pickup.

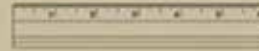

## Reduce Storm Water Runoff



Surfaces like driveways, sidewalks and streets prevent storm water runoff from naturally soaking into the ground.

The first inch of rainfall is responsible for the bulk of the pollutants in storm water runoff.



Storm water can pick up debris, chemicals and dirt.
