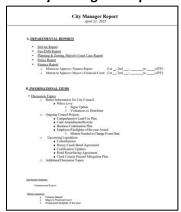

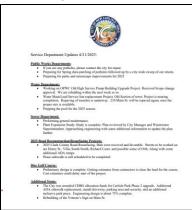

  - Pat Krabacher, 307 N. Henry St Commented on the recent food conferences that were attended, as well as many benefits of the garden to the community and the school.

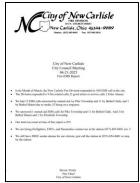

WHEREAS, the City desires to designate signatories for its financial accounts; and

- WHEREAS, Tax Administrator Colleen Rhea, Director of Public Service/Assistant City Manager Howard Kitko and Finance Director Colleen Harris are currently authorized as signatories; and
- WHEREAS, the City wishes to add City Manager Donald Ray Hall III as a signatory for its financial documents and accounts due to his recent appointment as the City Manager; and
- **WHEREAS**, it is necessary to designate duly authorized signatories on all financial accounts of the City by ordinance or resolution.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF NEW CARLISLE HEREBY RESOLVES that:

Section 1. Insofar as two authorized signatures are required on every negotiable instrument of the City, City Manager Donald Ray Hall III and Finance Director Colleen Harris are hereby authorized to act as signatories on all financial accounts of the City, including, without limitation, accounts now held or to be held in the future at the following institutions: National City Bank nka PNC Bank, New Carlisle Federal Savings Bank, Security National Bank nka Park National Bank and Star Ohio. At least one of their two signatures must appear on every negotiable instrument of the City.

<u>Section 2</u>. Council hereby authorizes Director of Public Service/Assistant City Manager Howard Kitko and Tax Administrator Colleen Rhea as secondary signatories on any negotiable instrument of the City EXCEPT for instruments that would change any of the financial accounts of the City.

<u>Section 3</u>. Only City Manager Donald Ray Hall III and Finance Director Colleen Harris have ordinance power to make changes to any financial account of the City.

**WHEREAS**, sections 5705.14, 5705.15 and 5705.16 of the Ohio Revised Code provide procedures for the legal transfer of funds; and

WHEREAS, legal transfers and/or advancements of funds by resolution are intended as a means of providing additional revenues to certain other funds that are in a negative fund balance status or requiring additional funding for anticipated expenses; and

**WHEREAS**, the City will be purchasing a columbarium for the interment of cremains at the City cemetery, and will need to install a foundation for the columbarium; and

**WHEREAS**, the advancement of \$76,740.00 will be paid back to the General Fund from the sale of columbarium niches.

## **RESOLUTION 2025-05R**

## A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE UPDATE OF THE CLARK COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION FIVE YEAR PLAN

**WHEREAS**, Clark County has experienced severe damage from several natural hazards on many occasions in the past century, resulting in property loss, loss of life, economic hardship, and threats to public health and safety; and

**WHEREAS**, the Clark County Emergency Management Agency has established the Clark County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee and the committee has, through an organized planning process, identified local problems and mitigation activities to help reduce hazards, damages, and loss of life during a natural hazard event; and

**WHEREAS**, the Clark County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Five Year Plan Update ("Plan") recommends many hazard mitigation actions that will protect the people and property affected by the natural hazards that face Clark County; and

WHEREAS, public hearings were held to review the Plan as required by law, and the Plan will hereby be implemented, monitored, evaluated, and updated annually by the Clark County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee. The Clark County Board of Commissioners will be the public authority to promote and oversee the continued maintenance of this Plan.

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF NEW CARLISLE HEREBY RESOLVES that:

<u>Section 1:</u> The Clark County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Five Year Plan Update is hereby adopted as an official plan of the City of New Carlisle, Ohio.

Section 2: The Clark County Emergency Management Agency will enter into an agreement, in the manner provided by law, under Ohio Revised Code Sections 5502.21 to 5502.411, including Section 5502.271, as amended, and has the power to coordinate and unify the comprehensive emergency management activities of the participants thereof, including the various municipal corporations and townships of Clark County, Ohio.

Section 3: The respective County, Township, District, City, and Village officials identified in the strategy of the Plan are hereby directed to implement the recommended actions assigned to them. These officials will report annually on their activities, accomplishments, and progress to the Clark County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee under the direction of the Clark County Board of Commissioners. This report shall be submitted to the Clark County Board of Commissioners by February 28th of each year.

<u>Section 4:</u> This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, there is currently no columbarium for the internment of cremains at the City's cemetery; and

**WHEREAS**, the City received the attached quote and proposed agreement for the purchase of a new 80 niche, 2-sided columbarium; and

**WHEREAS**, the columbarium will provide the City with another option for the internment of cremains and will save burial space at the cemetery; and

**WHEREAS**, the purchase price for the columbarium will be Sixty-One Thousand Seven Hundred Forty Dollars (\$61,740).

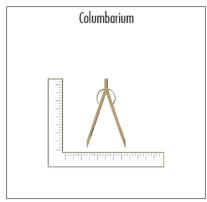

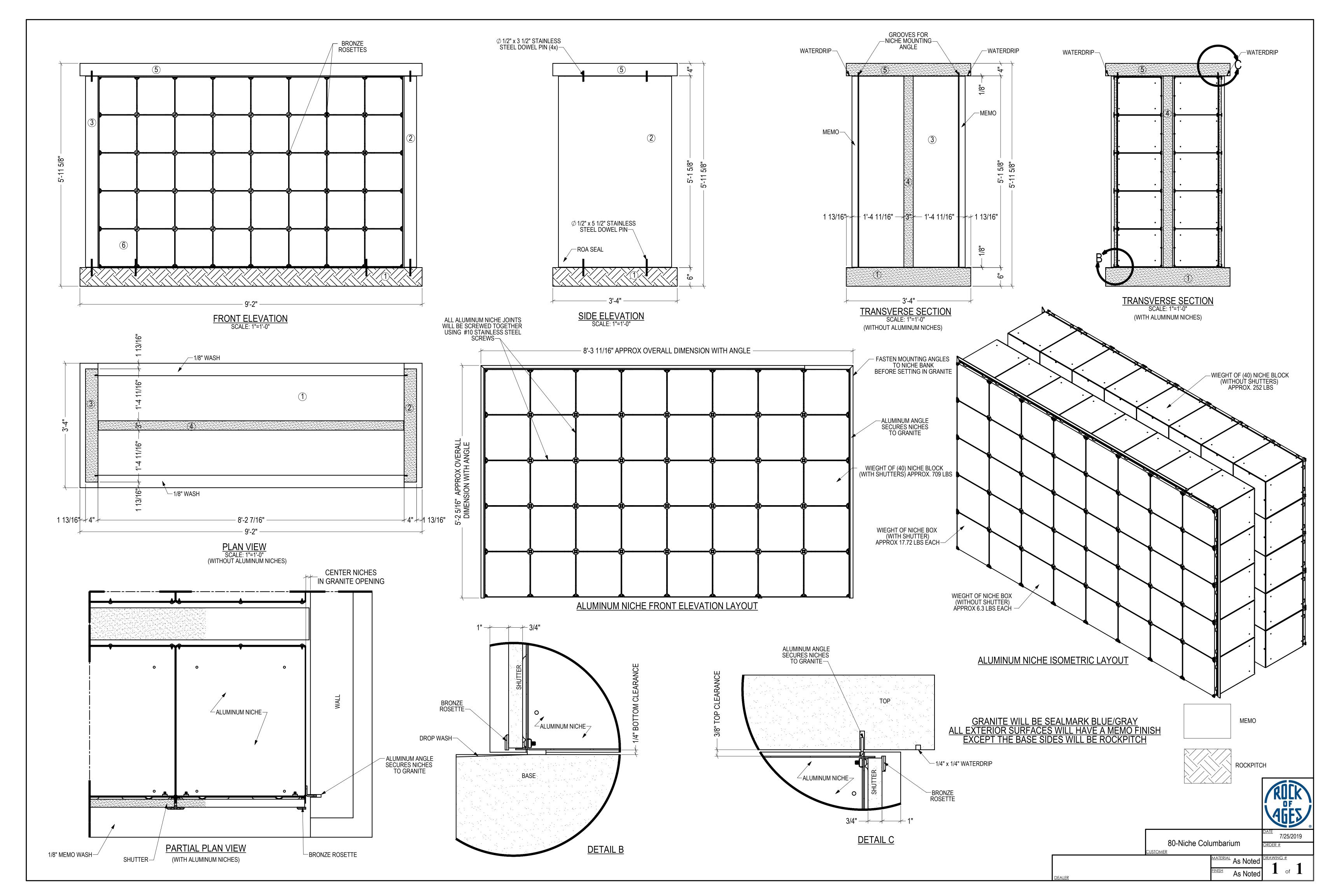
#### ADDENDUM TO NEW CARLISLE COLUMBARIUM AGREEMENT

- 1. NON-DISCRIMINATION: Both parties agree:
  - That, in the hiring of employees for the performance of work under the contract or any subcontract, no contractor or subcontractor, by reason of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability or military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Revised Code, national origin, or ancestry, shall discriminate against any citizen of this state in the employment of a person qualified and available to perform the work to which the contract relates; and
  - That no contractor, subcontractor, or person acting on behalf of any contractor or subcontractor, in any manner, shall discriminate against, intimidate, or retaliate against any employee hired for the performance of work under the contract on account of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability or military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Revised Code, national origin, or ancestry.
- 2. <u>ETHICS LAW</u>: Both parties certify that they are currently in compliance with and will continue to adhere to the requirements of the Ohio Ethics Law as provided by Ohio Revised Code Sections 102.03 and 102.04.
- 3. <u>CIVIL RIGHTS:</u> Both parties agree that in the performance of this agreement there shall be no discrimination against any client or any employee because of race, color, sex, religion, national origin, or any other factor specified in the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and subsequent amendments. Also included is the Americans with Disabilities Act. It is further agreed that both parties will fully comply with all applicable Federal and State laws regarding such discrimination and the right to and method of appeal will be made available to all persons served pursuant to the terms of this agreement.
- 4. <u>GOVERNING LAW:</u> The rights of all parties shall be governed by the Laws of the State of Ohio, without regard to any conflicts of law, rules or provisions. Sole and exclusive jurisdiction for any action or proceeding arising out of or related to this agreement shall be in an appropriate State or Federal Court located in Clark County, Ohio.
- 5. <u>SEVERABILITY:</u> If any portion of this Agreement is found to be void, unenforceable or against public policy, then the remaining portions of this Agreement shall not be affected, and each term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

#### 6. MISCELLANEOUS:

- (a) This Agreement constitutes the entire and integrated agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Agreement and supersedes any prior agreements and arrangements written or oral, between the parties.
- (b) This Agreement shall not be construed to create a partnership between the parties hereto.
- (c) Neither party shall assign or transfer their interest in this Agreement without the express written consent of the other party.
- (d) This Agreement may only be modified or amended by a written agreement between the parties.

7. <u>INSURANCE:</u> Seller shall be an independent contractor and not an employee of New Carlisle under this Agreement and shall maintain a policy of liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$500,000, while the Project is being completed, to cover any claims arising out of the performance of services under this Agreement, and shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend New Carlisle from any claims, costs, expenses or liabilities, including reasonable attorney fees, arising from any act or omission of Seller or Seller's agents. The obligations pursuant to this paragraph shall survive termination of this Agreement.

### **ORDINANCE 2025-20E**

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE/ASSISTANT CITY MANAGER, TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE BOARD OF CLARK COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE 2025 ROADWAY RESURFACING PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

**WHEREAS**, the City of New Carlisle has determined that it is necessary to resurface roadways within its municipal corporation limits; and

**WHEREAS**, the Clark County Engineer has agreed to engineer, bid and manage the roadway resurfacing project within the City of New Carlisle; and

**WHEREAS**, by working with the County, the overall size of the resurfacing project increases and thereby results in more favorable bids; and

**WHEREAS**, the stated maximum amount the City will pay under the agreement is \$216,832.61; however, because of the quality and competitiveness of the bids, an expenditure of funds of up to \$300,000.00, which would cover the stated contract amount and additional resurfacing work through the agreement, would be in the best interests of the City and its residents.

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF NEW CARLISLE HEREBY ORDAINS that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Manager, or the Director of Public Service/Assistant City Manager as the City Manager's designee, is authorized and directed to enter into the attached agreement on behalf of the City of New Carlisle with the Board of Clark County Commissioners for the 2025 Roadway Resurfacing Project.

Section 2. The City of New Carlisle authorizes the expenditure of funds of up to \$300,000.00, which is a sum sufficient to pay the stated maximum amount under the contract (i.e.,\$216,832.61) and additional resurfacing work through the agreement that would be in the best interests of the City and its residents.

Section 3. This ordinance is hereby determined to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the life, health, property and public peace of the residents of the City and for the further reason that the agreement must be timely executed so that the roadway resurfacing project within the City of New Carlisle will be promptly commenced, and this ordinance shall be deemed effective immediately upon the affirmative vote of at least six (6) City Council members.

This AGREEMENT entered into this	day of	, 2025, by and

and services under the 2025 Roadway Re	esurfacing Contra	ct, hereafter referred to as the
"PROJECT," entered into between the CC	DUNTY and its cho	osen contractor(s).

- 1. The CITY may purchase the reasonable quantity of pavement resurfacing materials and services under the PROJECT that is required for the needs of the CITY. The CITY shall pay for the actual quantity of materials and services provided to the CITY. The initial estimate of the amount of the contribution for the CITY, as well as other participating political subdivisions, and the COUNTY is attached hereto as Exhibit A. The CITY's resolution approving this Agreement shall comply with Section 735.053 (B) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- 2. The CITY shall directly and timely pay the contractor(s) on the PROJECT for all materials and services rendered to the CITY under the PROJECT. No payment made by the COUNTY to the contractor(s), for said materials and services, shall relieve the CITY from its responsibility for paying for said materials and services or for any materials and services rendered to the CITY in the future. The CITY shall immediately reimburse the COUNTY for any payments made by the COUNTY for any materials or services rendered to the CITY. The CITY understands and agrees that the COUNTY's obligations under this Agreement are subject to all terms, conditions, and limitations of the PROJECT.
- 3. The CITY and the COUNTY understand and agree that the actual amount each jurisdiction will be responsible for may vary based upon the actual quantity of product provided to each jurisdiction, potential liquid price adjustment, or change orders. The CITY agrees to be responsible for any additional amount attributed to the product and work actually provided to the CITY. However, pursuant to Section 735.053 (B) of the Ohio Revised Code, the maximum amount that the CITY is to pay to the contractor(s) under this Agreement is \$216,832.61.

## 4. The COUNTY agrees:

- (1) That, in the hiring of employees for the performance of work under the contract or any subcontract, no contractor or subcontractor, by reason of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability or military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Revised Code, national origin, or ancestry, shall discriminate against any citizen of this state in the employment of a person qualified and available to perform the work to which the contract relates; and
- (2) That no contractor, subcontractor, or person acting on behalf of any contractor or subcontractor, in any manner, shall discriminate against, intimidate, or retaliate against any employee hired for the performance of work under the contract on account of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability or military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Revised Code, national origin, or ancestry.

5. Each party agrees to be responsible for its own acts and omissions whether through itself or its agents, employees and contracted servants, and each party further agrees to defend itself and pay any judgments and costs arising out of such acts or omissions, and nothing in this Agreement shall impute or transfer any such responsibility from one party to the other.

This Agreement is executed, in triplicate, as of the date written above, by affixing the signatures of the respective parties hereto.
